Concept Sort

Objectives:

Introduces new vocabulary which students will see in the assigned text.

Allows students to share information they already know on a concept.

Familiarizes students with the vocabulary of a new topic or book.

Method:

Choose 10-15 relevant, important words from the book. Write them on the board or on individual cards.

Working individually or as small groups has the students sort the words into meaningful groups. The groups can be pre-determined by the teacher or an open sort by the students.


Describe the categories used for sorting the different groups. Have students explain why they sorted the words as they did. Go over any words that do not fit into the sort and re sort them as a group. Have the students label the sorted group for its attributes.

Evaluation:





Word Maps

Objectives:

Help students develop their understanding of a word.

Help students think about new terms or concepts in several ways.

Help build upon prior knowledge and visually represent new information.

Method:

Introduce the vocabulary word and the map to the students.

Teach them how to use the map by putting the target word in the central box.

Ask students to suggest words or phrases to put in the other boxes which answer the following questions: What is it? What is it like? What are some examples?

Encourage students to use synonyms and antonyms and a picture to help illustrate the new target word.

Model how to write a definition using the information on the word map.



List-Group-Label

Objectives:

Helps students organize their understanding of specific vocabulary and concepts.

Builds on students' prior knowledge about a topic.

Actively engages students in learning new vocabulary and content by activating critical thinking skills.

Teaches categorizing and labeling skills.

Method:

Select a main concept from the reading selection.

LIST: List and brainstorm all the words they think are related to the topic.

GROUP: Divide into small groups and have the students divide the words into obvious categories.

LABEL: Label the categories with a title and have them present their lists to the large group with the reasoning behind their groupings.

Evaluation:

Observation and completion of group work

Word Meaning Maps

Objectives:

Understand word meanings by finding the components of the words

Use a dictionary properly to find word meanings.

Method:

Choose a vocabulary word from the text.

Demonstrate how to use the dictionary to find the word meanings and parts with the group.

Give each individual student a vocabulary word from the text or from the concept being learned in class.

Have them fill out the word meaning map for the vocabulary word.




